

## NEWS AND UPDATES

### “Don’t Give Up, Don’t Ever Give Up”



That famous quote uttered by Jim Valvano, former NC State head basketball coach, during his ESPY speech in 1993 has become the mantra of St. Mark’s Long Range Planning Subcommittee as we work toward bringing an affordable, licensed child care center to our place of worship. We continue to persevere and push through the challenges that have accompanied this project.

We’re so grateful for our partnership with Christine W. Avery Learning Center - the experts at providing excellent child care! When this project comes to fruition, our partnership will result in a child care center that serves 20 children ages 3 and 4. With Buncombe County families who have young children on a waiting list for quality child care, opening our doors will bring relief to those parents seeking care for their children.

Realizing our current playground does not meet licensing standards for egress, we developed a proposal to create a playground on the North Liberty property that was approved by Council last fall. We received approval of our plans from the City and Child Care Licensure in late February. As plans have developed, we have discovered there are conflicting surveys for this part of the church property. Which survey has the correct survey lines designated??? You probably see where this is going...

John Yurko, our chosen architect, is now initiating as *new* survey! And so, we wait...and continue to recite, “Don’t give up, don’t ever give up.” Please join us in the recitation (and in prayer!) as we continue to move through this process. Our plan moving forward is to provide an update via this newsletter each month.

In his closing remarks, Jim Valvano stated, “I thank God for this day and for the moments I have.” Please know we do, too, and we know this is still the work God wants us to do. We are the light of Christ - and we are led to help children in need!
